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ACADEMIC COUNCIL MEETING I – 2019

Minutes of the Meeting

I BEFORE PROCEEDING WITH THE REGULAR BUSINESS ON THE AGENDA

Dr. Smt M. Malarvizhi, Principal and the Chairperson welcomed the honourable members of the First Academic Council Meeting of Sri Sarada College for Women, Tirunelveli. She expressed that, on the recommendations of the Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli and the Government of Tamilnadu, the University Grants Commission, New Delhi has conferred Autonomous Status to this college with effect from 2019 – 20 academic year. Further she reported as follows:

The college was founded by Swami Chidbhavananda in 1986 and now has 11 UG Programmes, 6 PG Programmes, 4 M.Phil., and 2 PhD Programmes. Besides it offers 30 (Entrepreneurial, Personality development, Placement oriented) Certificate and 4 Diploma programmes. The college has been recognized as a Research Centre by Manonmaniam Sundaranar University for conducting research activities leading to Ph.D degree in Computer Science and Commerce.

2. Eligibility for pass in Bachelor Degree

Ms. N. Renuka, HoD English moved that the candidate seeking pass in Degree of Bachelor of Arts/Science/Commerce/Commerce (Corporate Secetaryship)/Computer Applications/Business Administration shall be required to have pursued the prescribed course and evaluation in the college for a period of not less than three academic years of six semesters and passed all the examinations prescribed including project / internship by submission of dissertation / report within the prescribed time.

3. Duration of semesters for the Under graduate Degree Programme

that the duration of each semester shall be 99 working days (90 contact days + 9 days of Formative CIA Examination) with 5 periods of one hour duration each as prescribed by Manonmaniam Sundaranar University / TNSCHE / UGC.

The first academic year shall comprise the first and second semesters. The second academic year shall comprise the third and fourth semesters. The third academic year shall comprise the fifth and sixth semesters

4. Minimum attendance required to appear for summative examinations at the end of each semester

that no candidate shall be permitted to appear for the Summative Examinations at the end of each semester unless she puts in minimum 75% of attendance and has completed all the formative evaluation requirements. Absence for an hour shall be treated as absence for the



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TIRUNELVELI 627011 session. However, the candidates with attendance range from 60 to 74% may be permitted to appear for the summative examination on the approval of the condonation committee, after having analysed genuinely and approved. The candidate has to pay the required fee towards the same.

Any candidate who is lacking minimum requirement of attendance on medical grounds / any unforeseen reasons to a maximum of seven days shall submit written request through proper channel. However, the decision on the acceptance / rejection of such application lies with the management/Principal or the committee constituted for the purpose. A student may avail condonation only for two times in her entire course of study of 6 semesters. Candidates who do not satisfy the minimum requirement of attendance in a semester shall appear for summative examination of that semester by attending classes (minimum of 75%) for that semester after completing the prescribed period of the course (i.e., three years)

Dr N.Kamala HoD Commerce (CS) seconded the motion and passed.

6. Declaration of pass and classification of successful candidates:

Further moved that a candidate shall be declared to have passed the examinations both in theory and practical examinations of all courses, if she obtained not less than 40% of marks in summative examination and 40% of marks in summative examination and Formative examination (CIA) taken together along with prescribed project / internship.

In case of change in syllabus, the candidates reappearing will be given a maximum of one year to appear for the examination covered under old syllabus. Beyond one year, the candidate has to appear for examination with new syllabus or equivalent paper as prescribed.

Candidates who have passed in the examination and have secured following marks shall be declared as:

- a. 75% and above in first attempt First Class with Distinction
- b. 60 and above but below 75% First Class;
- c. 50 and above but below 60% II Class and
- d. 40 and above but below 50% in III Class

Dr. N. Krishnan and Dr. S. Madhavan suggested including "First attempt" for"First Class with Distinction" Classification and the house approved.

The candidate seeking pass in Degree of Master of Computer Applications (general) shall required to have pursued the prescribed programme of study in the college for a period of not less than three academic years of six semesters and passed all the examinations both theory and practical, as applicable, prescribed including project / internship by submission of dissertation / report within the prescribed time.

The candidate seeking pass in Degree of Master of Computer Applications (lateral) shall required to have pursued the prescribed programme of study in the college for a period of not less than two academic years of four semesters and passed all the examinations both theory and practical, as applicable, prescribed including project / internship by submission of dissertation / report within the prescribed time

9. Duration of semesters for the Post graduate Degree Programme

Further moved that no candidate shall be permitted to appear for the Summative Examinations at the end of each semester, unless she puts in not less than 75% of

attendance and has completed all the formative evaluation requirements. However, the candidates with attendance range from 60 to 74% may be permitted to appear for the summative examination on the approval of the condonation committee, after having analysed genuinely and approved. The candidate has to pay the required fee towards the same.

Absence for an hour shall be treated as absence for the session. Any candidate who is lacking minimum requirement of attendance on medical grounds / any unforeseen reasons to a maximum of seven days shall submit written request through proper channel. However, the decision on the acceptance / rejection of such application lies with the Management / Principal or the Committee constituted for the purpose. A student may avail condonation onlyonce in her entire course of PG study (4 semesters)

Candidates who do not satisfy the minimum requirement of attendance in a semester shall appear for summative examination of that semester by attending classes (minimum of 75%) for that semester after completing the prescribed period of the course (i.e., two years / three years as applicable) **Dr V.Sangeetha** Joint Dean – Autonomous seconded the motion and passed

Ms. V.Raja Rajeswari HoD Chemistry moved that a candidate shall be declared to have passed the examinations both in theory and practical examinations of all courses if she obtained not less than 40% of marks in summative examination and 40% of marks in summative examination and continuous internal assessment taken together. It include Project/Internship / on the job training.

In case of change in syllabus the candidates reappearing will be given a maximum of 1 year to appear for the examination covered by old syllabus. Beyond1 year, the candidate has to appear for examination with new syllabus or equivalent paper as prescribed by the Chairman, BoS.

Dr. S. Madhavan proposed to give two chances, the house discussed and approved.

Hence, in case of change in syllabus the candidates reappearing will be given a maximum of two chances to appear for the examination covered by old syllabus. Beyond two chances, the candidate has to appear for examination with new syllabus or equivalent paper as prescribed by the Chairman, BoS.

- b. 60 and above but below 75%

Further moved that the candidate seeking pass in Master of Philosophy in Arts / Science/Commerce/Computer Science shall required to have pursued the prescribed programme of study in the college for a period of not less than one academic year of two semesters and passed all the examinations both theory and practical, as applicable, prescribed including project / internship by submission of dissertation / report within the prescribed time.



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15. Duration of semesters for the M.Phil Degree Programme

Further moved that the duration of each semester shall be 99 working days (90 contact days + 9 days Formative CIA examinations) with 5 periods of one hour duration each or as prescribed by Manonmaniam Sundaranar University / TNSCHE / UGC. The academic year shall comprise the first and second semesters.

<u>16. Minimum attendance required to appear for summative examinations at the end of each semester</u>

Further moved that no candidate shall be permitted to appear for the Summative Examinations at the end of each semester, unless she puts in not less than 75% of attendance and has completed all the formative evaluation requirements. However candidates with 60% to 74 % attendance may be approved by the condonation committee by paying a codonation fee prescribed. Absence for an hour shall be treated as absence for the session.

Any candidate who is lacking minimum requirement of attendance on medical grounds / any unforeseen reasons to a maximum of seven days shall submit written request through proper channel. However, the decision on the acceptance / rejection of such application lies with the Management / Principal or the Committee constituted for the purpose. A student may avail condonation only once in her entire course of study (2 semesters)

Candidates who do not satisfy the minimum requirement of attendance in a semester shall appear for summative examination of that semester by attending classes (minimum of 75%) for that semester after completing the prescribed period of the course (i.e., one year)

17. Evaluation:

Further moved that the candidates will be evaluated by both Continuous Formative Examinations (CIA) and Summative Examinations (SE)

18. Declaration of pass and classification of successful candidates:

Further moved that a candidate shall be declared to have passed the examinations both in theory and practical examinations of all courses, if she obtained not less than 50%

marks in summative examination and Formative examination (CIA) taken together along with required Project/ Internship / on the job training. In case of change in syllabus the candidates reappearing will be given a maximum of 1 year to appear for the examination covered by old syllabus. Beyond 1 year, the candidate has to appear for examination with new syllabus or equivalent paper as prescribed

Candidates who have passed in the examination and have secured

- a. 75% and above in first attempt
- b. 60% and above but below 75%
- c. 50% and above but below 60%



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TIRUNELVELI 627011 of marks at the end of programme shall be declared to have passed their programme in First Class with distinction, First Class and Second Class respectively.

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20. Valuation and declaration of results:

Dr. K.Ramalakshmi, COE – Autonomous moved that Double valuation for Part I, Part II and Part III theory courses of all UG programmes by internal and external examiners.

All practical courses will be jointly evaluated by an external examiner and an internal examiner. Single valuation by internal examiner for Part IV, Certificate and Diploma courses of all programmes

There will be double valuation for all PG courses including MPhil.,, one by external examiner and other will be by internal examiner. The average will be taken as the marks scored by the candidate. If the variation between the two examiners exceeds 15%, the paper will be sent for III valuation by an external examiner / internal examiner. In such cases, the marks, which are closer, will be considered for averaging.

Principal is empowered to award two marks, if any candidate fails for want of two marks either in external (i.e., external passing minimum) or in total (internal + external).

On completion of entire valuation process, the results will be declared by placing before the Awards Committee constituted for the purpose convened by the Dean, Autonomous.

21. <u>Re-totalling, revaluation and provision of photocopy of answer scripts</u>:

Further moved that the candidates who desire to have their answer scripts of the summative examinations re-totalled or revalued or those requiring photocopy of the answer scripts shall apply to the Controller of Examinations of the college in the relevant form by paying prescribed fee within the scheduled date announced by the Office of CoE. If the marks obtained in re-totalling or revaluation is higher than the marks awarded earlier, revised marks statement will be issued after withdrawing the previous one.



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22. Arrear and Supplementary examinations:

Ms. V.Raja Rajeswari HoD Chemistry moved that the candidates if failed in any course in any semester may appear for arrear examinations in any subsequent semester examinations by registering in specific registration form issued by the office of the CoE and by paying prescribed fee within the scheduled date announced by the office of CoE. Late applications will not be entertained.

The candidates if failed in any course in any semester may appear for arrear examinations in any subsequent semester examinations by registering in specific registration form issued by the office of the COE and by paying prescribed fee within the scheduled date announced by the office of COE. Late applications will not be entertained.

Supplementary examinations will be conducted only for those final semester examinations i.e., sixth semester for UG and MCA (general); fourth semester for all PG courses; second semester for M.Phil. Candidates who have appeared and failed in the final semester examinations alone are eligible for applying for supplementary examinations. However if a candidate is having an arrear of two papers in any of the semesters, keeping the candidate"s one year life time value, the candidate may be permitted to appear for supplementary examination.

Dr. S. Madhavan proposed that if a candidate failed in only one course (irrespective of the semester) and passed in all other courses, may write supplementary examinations at the end of the Programme period. The house discussed, adopted.

Ms N.Renuka, HoD English seconded the motion and passed.



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23. Examiners for question setting, paper valuation, practical examinations, evaluation of UG, PG and M.Phil dissertations and conduct of viva – voce examinations:

Dr. N.Kamala HoD Commerce (CS) moved that the panel of examiners for question setting, paper valuation practical examinations, evaluation of UG and PG dissertations and conduct of viva – voce examinations will be prepared by the office of CoE by obtaining details of the examiners such as qualifications, experience, course/field of interest from various institutions.

Examiners for evaluating M.Phil., dissertation will be selected from the panel of examiners (3 members within the Tirunelveli (considered as station examiners) & 3 members from outside Tirunelveli (considered as outstation examiners) recommended in writing by the Chairperson, BoS of the Programme in consultation with the Guide concerned.

Ms. N. Renuka HoD English seconded the motion and passed.

24. Award of degrees:

Ms N.Renuka HoD English moved that the Principal is authorized to recommend to Manonmaniam Sundaranar University for the award of degrees to successful candidates based on the results of the examination conducted by the college with the approval of Awards Committee by submitting copy of marks statement of all successful candidates with prescribed fee.

Dr N.Kamala, HoD Commerce (CS)seconded the motion and passed.
